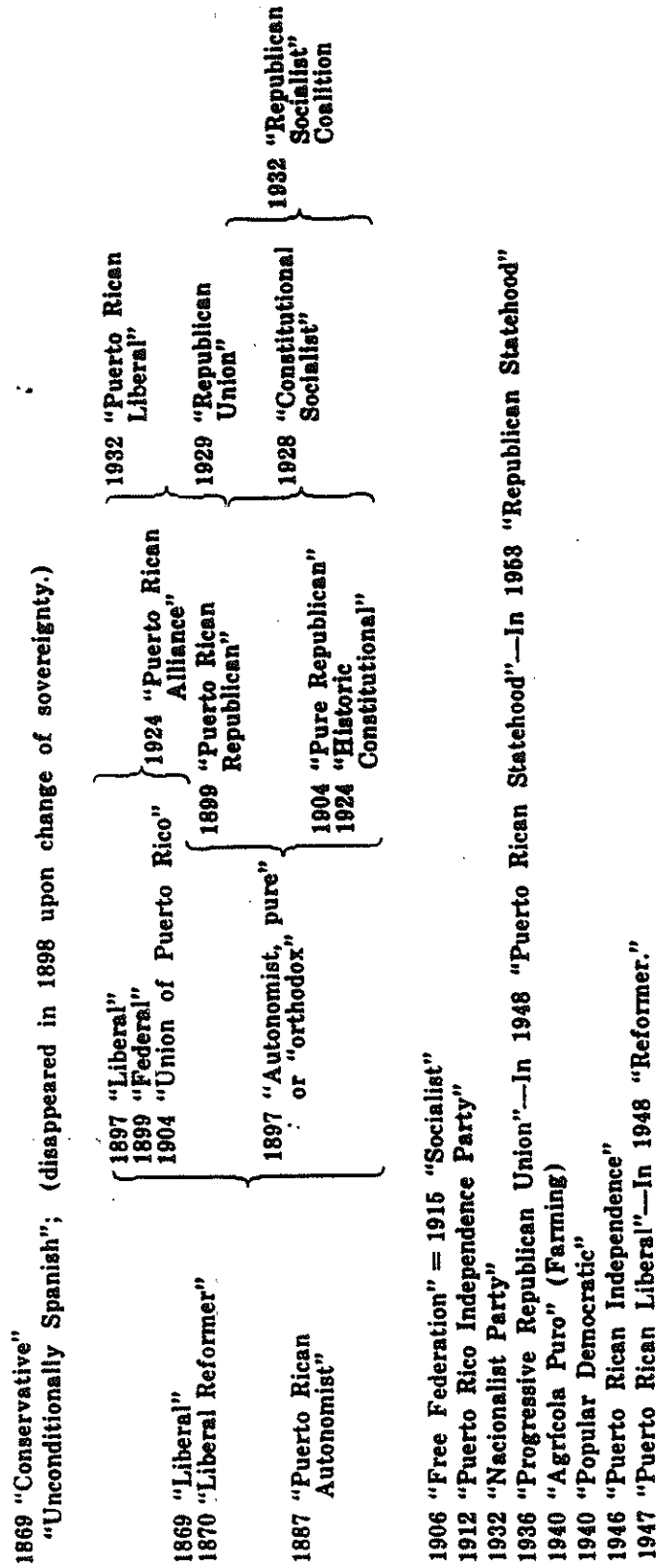

- (a) 1917 In the general election of this year, 102,423 voted for prohibition; 64,227 voted against it. The general elections of this year were held under the new system established by the Jones Organic Act, promulgated by the Congress of the United States on March 2, 1917. The elections were held on July 16 of that year. With this constitutional change there was established a bicameral legislative system. There was created the Senate, which did not exist before. From the approval of the Foraker Act on May 1, 1900, legislating in Puerto Rico had been through a House of Delegates and the Executive Council, now Council of Secretaries.
- (b) 1924 Is formed the Puerto Rican Alliance, a political agreement between the parties Union of Puerto Rico and Puerto Rican Republican. The Constitutional Political Party was a split of the Puerto Rican Republican Party which did not accept the agreement with the Union of Puerto Rico Party.
- (c) 1928 The Puerto Rican Alliance took part in the elections of this year for the second time, but was dissolved a year later, the "Good-Government Group" being formed. This brought about the formation of new parties in the year 1932. The Constitutional Socialist Party was a coalition of the Socialist and the Historic Constitutional parties.
- (d) 1932 Splits of the Puerto Rican Alliance which formed part of the "Good-Government Group" adopted the name of Republican Union. Another group of the same Puerto Rican Alliance formed the Liberal Puerto Rican Party. In this year women who knew how to read and write voted for the first time. The Nationalist Party was registered as a party by petition and took part in the general elections of 1932.
- (e) 1936 This year universal suffrage was established in Puerto Rico.
- (f) 1940 The Puerto Rican Unification was a group of liberals and dissidents of the Republican Union and Socialist Parties. The Agrícola Puro Party is a group of dissidents of the Socialist Party whose votes were added to the Puerto Rican Unification. The Popular Democratic Party was officially founded on July 21 of this year.
- (g) 1946 The Puerto Rican Independence Party was founded in Bayamón.
- (h) 1948 The Republican Union adopted the name of Puerto Rican Statehood Party and the Puerto Rican Liberal Party that of Reformer. The Governor of Puerto Rico was elected for the first time that year.
- (i) 1951 On June 4 the voters accepted to draft their own constitution, casting 387,016 for and 119,169 against. At this election the consolidation of the municipalities of San Juan and Río Piedras was also approved. The result of the election in both precincts was as follows: 46,158 votes for and 27,359 against. On August 27 of that same year there were elected the representatives to the Constitutional Convention of Puerto Rico. The Popular Democratic Party with 70 members, the Puerto Rican Statehood Party with 15 members and the Socialist Party with 7 members, participated in this election.
- (j) 1952 On March 3 of this year, the Referendum takes place for the acceptance or rejection of the Constitution submitted to the voters: 374,649 votes for and 82,928 against. In the Constitutional Convention the result had been: 88 members for, 3 against and one absent. On November 4 there was held under the Constitutional of the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico and simultaneously there is submitted to the consideration of the voters the amendments to Section 5 of Article II and Section 3 of Article VII of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, with the following results: Article II: 419,515 votes for; 58,204 against. Article VII: 420,086 for; 56,484 against.
- (k) 1953 Beginning this year, the Puerto Rican Statehood Party changed its name for that of Republican Party of Puerto Rico, under which name it participated in the General Elections of 1956 and 1960.
- (l) The political group known as Christian Action Party was registered in 60 electoral precincts and obtained fifty-two thousand ninety six (52,096) votes.
- (m) The political group known as the Voice of Puerto Rico Party was registered in Carolina and obtained twenty-nine (20) votes.
- (n) The total number of votes for the office of Governor of Puerto Rico (in this case 759,487) is, by law, the leading number for every computation. For example: ten per cent of that number maintains the existence of the political parties. (See Section 14 of the Election Law).
